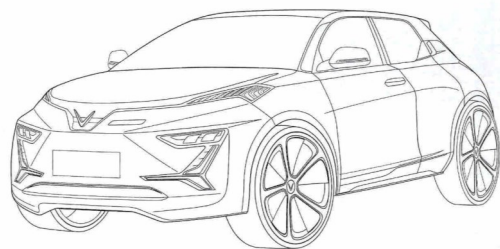


What type of Industrial Design is registered in Brunei?

There are many varieties of industrial designs registered, such examples are bottle designs, car designs, patterns on textiles, etc.

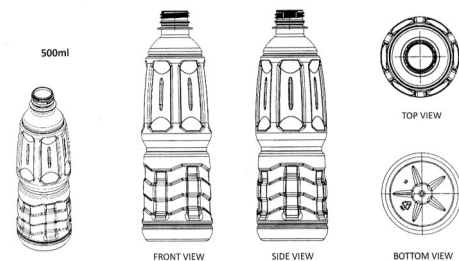

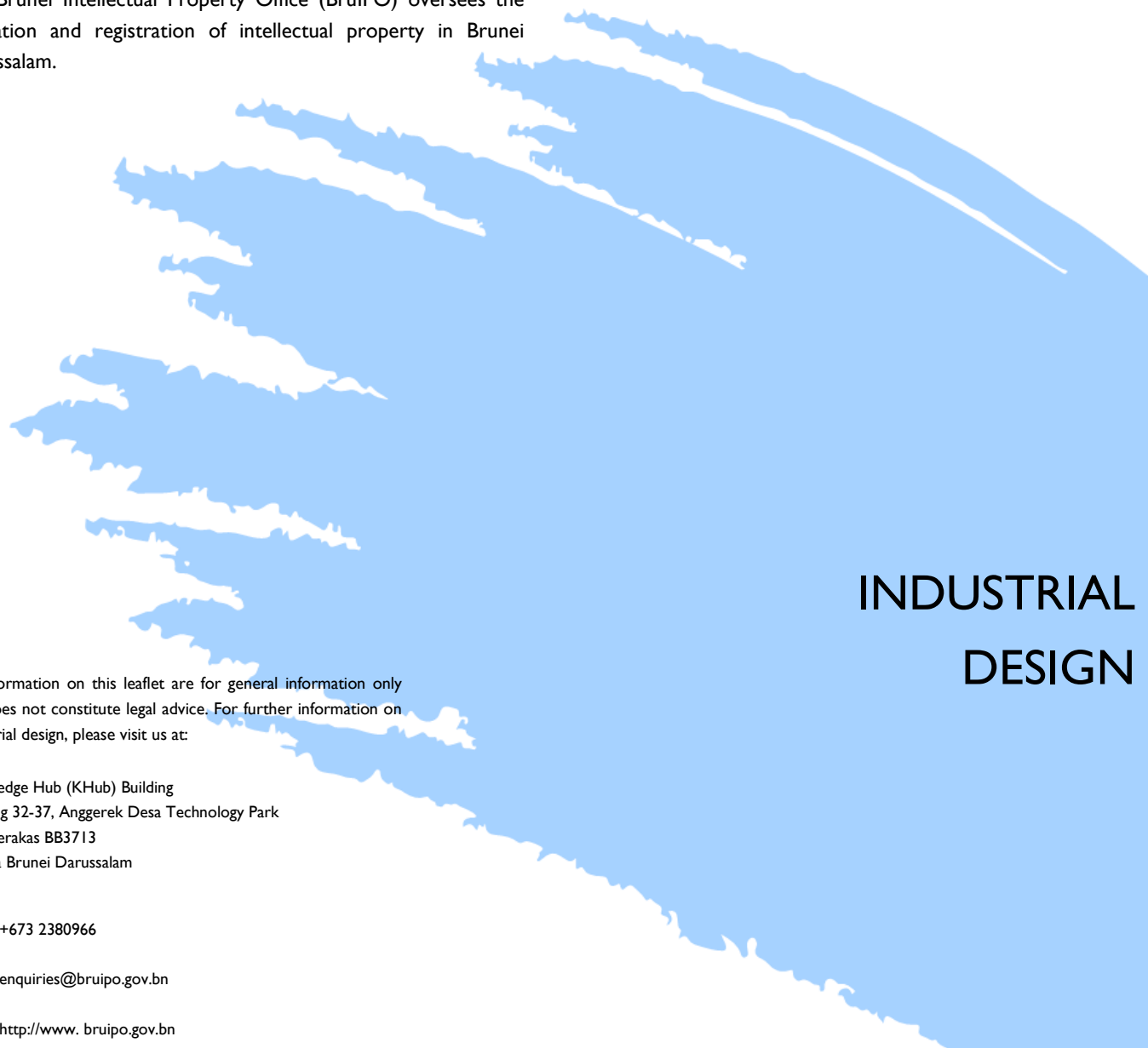

INDUSTRIAL DESIGN

What is an Industrial Design?

An industrial design is the features of shape, configuration, pattern or ornament which when applied to an article gives the product a unique appearance. It does not include a method or principle of construction.

Industrial designs are applied to a wide variety of products of industry and handicraft; technical and medical instruments; watches, jewelry and other luxury items; house wares and electrical appliances; vehicles and architectural structures as well as textile designs and leisure goods.



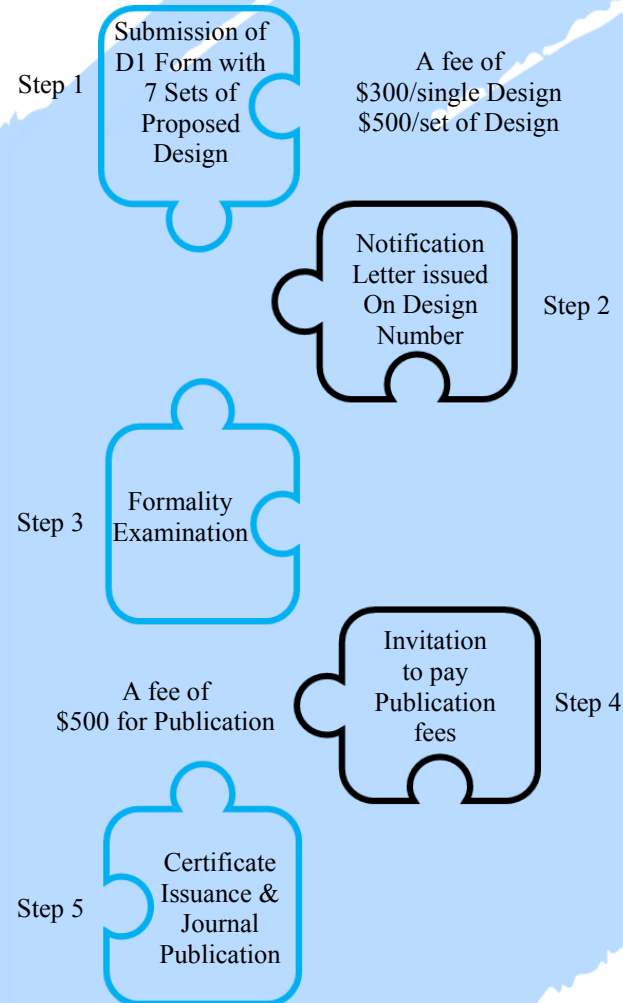
Why do we protect Industrial Design?

Industrial design do make a product attractive and appealing. Hence, they add to the commercial value of a product. A registered industrial design will give the owner an exclusive right to stop others from copying or continuing to use that industrial design without the owner's consent.

What designs can be registered?

To be registrable, an industrial design must be new during the filing date of the application, or the priority date, if the priority date is claimed. An industrial design is new if it has not been registered, published or sold in Brunei Darussalam or elsewhere before the date on which the application for registration is lodged.

APPLICATION PROCESS



Can one or more Industrial Designs be included in an application?

Yes, provided the industrial designs relate to the same class of product as classified under the Locarno Classification, or to the same set of products. A set of product means 2 or more product of the same or similar design and the same general character that are usually sold together or intended to be used together, for example a tea set.



How long is an Industrial Design protected?

A registered industrial design is protected for a period of 5 years beginning from the filing date and can be renewed for a further period of 10 years upon payment of a renewal fee, which is payable every 5 years.



Is a registered design protected worldwide?

No, industrial design protection is territorial and is only valid in the country where it is registered. However, as Brunei Darussalam had acceded to the Hague Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Industrial Designs in 2013, it is possible to protect an industrial design in multiple countries or regions with minimal formalities by filing an 'international' application via the Hague route.
